From our Pastor May is for Scripture Memory



As we venture into the summer months, allow me to encourage you in one of the most important spiritual disciplines. In Psalm 119:11, the Bible says, “I have treasured your word in my heart so that I may not sin against you.” The Psalmist had a devotion to Scripture memory. He intentionally remembered God’s Word so that he might receive spiritual strength from it.

Many modern believers assume that Scripture memory is an impossible task. They silently conclude that they aren’t good at remembering things. In addition, many of our modern conveniences have diminished the importance of remembering things. One has commented, “According to a survey conducted in 2007 by a neuropsychologist at Trinity College Dublin, fully a third of Brits under the age of thirty can’t remember even their own home land line number without pulling it up on their handsets. The same survey found that 30 percent of adults can’t remember the birthdays of more than three immediate family members. Our gadgets have eliminated the need to remember such things anymore.”¹

Despite our modern aversion to memorization, the Psalmist extolled the value of Scripture memory. He used a purpose statement, saying, “...so that I may not sin against you.” According to the Psalmist, Scripture memory is beneficial because it has a way of protecting against sin. Because Christians live life on fallen Earth, we face constant pressures and promptings to evil from the world, the flesh, and the devil. Their primary offensive weapon against such things is God’s Word (Ephesians 6:17).

We can wield the sword of God’s Word in a number of ways. One of them involves Scripture memory. Though many think the practice is hard to do, let me share four means I have sometimes used for storing God’s Word in my heart and mind. Perhaps if you try one of these practices, you might get better at memorizing Scripture this May.

Writing — At one point, I used a journal for Scripture memory. Each week, I selected a verse for memory. During my morning devotional time, I would write the verse out five times in my journal. By day four or so, I seemed to have the verse mostly memorized. The act of writing and seeing the words of Scripture on paper did a lot to drive the verse down into my brain.

Praying — Not long ago, I committed to memorizing the entirety of Psalm 51, but I altered the method I used. Instead of writing the words of the Psalm, I prayed them. During my daily prayer time, I sincerely recited the words from my heart to the Lord. After a couple of weeks, I began to gain a good grasp of the first few verses of the Psalm. Over a span of months, I had memorized the entire passage.

Reading — When I was in college, I met an older man who had a remarkable ability to recite Scripture. I inquired about the secret to his strong memory. He said he had once heard that the human brain can remember anything after one reads it ninety times. I’m not sure that what he shared was absolutely correct; however, I do think he made a valid point to a degree. Continued exposure to something through reading will make one more likely to remember it. I say all of this to say reading your Bible will do a lot to help you with Scripture memory. If you have the practice of reading the Bible on a systematic basis, certain passages of Scripture will naturally stick in your head.

Smart Phone Apps — Modern technology is a curse in some regards, but it is a blessing in others. One good thing is the way the internet, computers, and smart devices provide us with more tools for studying and applying Scripture. Bible memory has also benefited from modern technology. There are a host of smart phone apps that can help you memorize God’s Word. I recommend one called “Fighter Verses.” With the app, you can make a list of verses to memorize, you can track your progress, and you can even make the lock screen or home screen of your phone display your memory verse for the week.

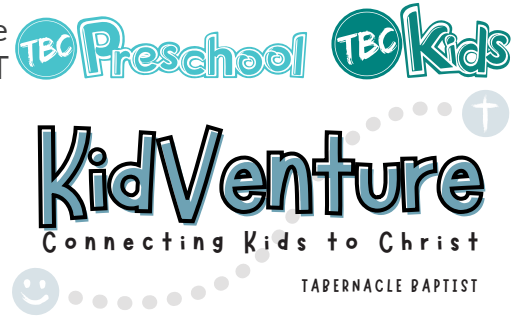
KidVenture
