Three important topics related to parental correction...

1. A _____ IN CORRECTION

This involves avoiding attitudes, words, and actions which would drive a child to angry exasperation or resentment and thus rules out excessively severe discipline, unreasonably harsh demands, abuse of authority, arbitrariness, unfairness, constant nagging and condemnation, subjecting a child to humiliation, and all forms of gross insensitivity to a child’s needs. **Cleon Rogers Jr. and Cleon Rogers III**
