TABERNACLE SUMMER MISSIONS



We will have a special commissioning for the Summer Mission Teams, Sunday June 5th.

- 1. Kid Venture (Local Missions) June 6-9. We have eight sites throughout Bartow County (2 morning, 6 evening), with 200+ Tabernacle volunteers! Pray for good weather and the gospel to be shared clearly.
- 2. Riva, Italy (International Missions) June 17-25. A team of 6 will lead English Summer Laboratory (like VBS). Pray that this will open-up opportunities for the Carpenter's (one of our families on the field) to reach families in their community.
- 3. Students in Utah (National Missions), June 24-July 2. A team of 47 students and leaders will be conducting ministries at 2 sites in northern Utah: Valley Baptist in Smithfield and Emmanuel Baptist in Hyrum. They will connect with students during planned activities. Please pray for good weather and the gospel to be shared clearly. We are also praying for students to fall in love with Great Commission Work.
- 4. International Family Youth Camp (International Missions), July 17-23. A team of Tabernacle staff and college students will minister to youth at a conference for international mission families in Orlando. This will be a week of planned camp for students who normally don't get to have camp. Please pray for this team to have an effective week ministering to these students.
- 5. International Family Kid's Camp (International Missions), July 28-August 2. A team (not finalized, if you're interested contact Steve McCombs), will provide a VBS-style day camp including outings and activities in Orlando for kids from several families connected to one of our families on the field. Please pray for an effective ministry week for these children.

From our Pastor Gospel Forgetfulness

Like many Bible readers, I'm often amazed by the disciples' blindness to Jesus' mission. Though He frequently told them of how He would die and be raised (Mark 8:31; 9:31; 10:33), they remained ignorant of such things. Up to the very moment of His arrest, they fought for their vision of what they wanted Jesus to be and do (Mark 14:47). When I read through the gospel accounts each year, it is a bit frustrating to read of their stubborn ignorance. However, if I am honest with myself, I am a lot like them. I often forget God's promises.



Failure in these areas is rooted in humanity's fallen nature. Neither culture, gender, genetics, or past experiences are ultimately to blame. The ladies who followed Jesus were little different than the Twelve. On resurrection morning, they approached Jesus' tomb in order to anoint His body with burial spices. They firmly believed He was dead. The possibility of resurrection wasn't on their minds in the least. Approaching the tomb, they saw two men "in dazzling clothes" (Luke 24:4). The men weren't just any men. They were angels! Seeing the sulking women, the men asked, "Why are you looking for the living among the dead?" (Luke 24:5). The angels' question is one that could be asked of many believers, as many are forgetful of resurrection truth.

As we head into the summer months, let's make sure we have our hearts and minds set on gospel realities. The flurry of activities can make us forget what matters most. It's easy to get our hearts so set on the things of life that we lose sight of Christ. May we not be guilty of living like Jesus' first followers, blind and ignorant of His resurrection power. Consider three ways we can safeguard ourselves from gospel forgetfulness.

Remembering Jesus' Words

Knowing that the women at the tomb had forgotten Jesus' promises, the angels encouraged them, saying, "Remember how he spoke to you when he was still in Galilee" (Luke 24:6). Their admonition emphasized an important spiritual discipline. God's people must remember God's Words. They must do what the Psalmist gave testimony of in Psalm 119:11 — "I have treasured your word in my heart so that I may not sin against you." Such activity requires regular attention to reading and studying God's Word. It also involves listening to teaching and preaching. However, such things alone aren't sufficient for a life of godliness. One must have a plan to intentionally and strategically remember God's Words. The first disciples heard teaching from Jesus Himself, but that alone wasn't enough to safeguard them from gospel forgetfulness. Their failure was rooted in a negligence to remember what Jesus said. Learn a lesson from the Twelve. Memorize God's Word.

Thinking on Jesus' Words

Once they have stored God's Word in their hearts, believers must then cultivate the practice of thinking on those words. When the ladies at the tomb heard the angels' instructions, they directed their minds to what Jesus had taught them in the past. Luke 24:8 says, "And they remembered his words." Their experience reveals that recalling and meditating on Jesus' words is a key to spiritual strength and success. Scripture instructs us in this matter by saying, "Your heart must hold on to my words. Keep my commands and live" (Proverbs 4:4). To avoid gospel forgetfulness, work at developing the habit of thinking on gospel truth. Don't let your down time be filled with vain thoughts. Avoid the temptation to allow the noise of social media to dominate your headspace. Make it your practice to put your mind on the principles of the gospel. Regularly preach Jesus to yourself!

Sharing Jesus' Words

After the women thoroughly remembered Christ's words, they ran to share the news of the resurrection with others. The Bible says, "Returning from the tomb, they reported all these things to the Eleven and to all the rest" (Luke 24:9). From their example, we can deduce a powerful principle for gospel-centered living. A good way to remember the gospel is to regularly share the gospel. When the truth of Jesus is regularly on our lips, we will be more likely to set our hearts on it. Avoid a lifestyle in which you rarely think of all the Lord has done for you. Tell others about Him!
