Our committees and officers are appointed and approved by the church, and they represent the church in the business of the church. Matthew 18:19 and Acts 6:5 reveal that the congregation should have a voice and vote in all major matters related to church business. Committees and officers are a man-made means of giving the congregation representation in such things.

Only July 31, you will hear updates from these groups at our Quarterly Vision Night & Church Conference. Pastor Patrick will also share from God's Word, giving a challenge related to our church vision. Important to this quarter's church conference is the fact that we will vote to approve a slate of committees and officers, along with a slate of deacons, for the 2022-2023 church year. We will also be presenting David Basham, Kevin Cook, and Brad Wasmund to be ordained as deacons at the August 28 Deacon Ordination Service. After vision night and Church Conference, we will enjoy a time of fellowship with hot dogs and homemade ice cream in the Fellowship Hall. From our Pastor

5 Prayers for Sunday Morning

The Sunday morning gathering of God's people is a commemoration of Jesus' resurrection. Since that first resurrection morning (Matthew 28:1), God's people have gathered on the first day of the week to worship the Lord (1 Corinthians 16:1-2). Even when he was exiled to lone solitude on the Island of Patmos, the apostle John gave careful attention to Lord's Day worship (Revelation 1:9). The Bible calls us to follow in the apostle's footsteps. It warns about "... neglecting to gather together, as some are in the habit of doing" (Hebrews 10:25).



What is involved with faithfulness to the Sunday morning gathering of God's people? Participation is surely key, but prayers are also important. All throughout the week, God's people should intercede on behalf of the Lord's day gathering. Recently we have studied Paul's words to the Philippians during our Sunday preaching time. From the first chapter of his letter, we have focused on the subject of the church. In Philippians 1:9-11, we saw that Paul made prayer for the church a priority. His commitment is a model for us. One way we can pray for our church is by praying for our Sunday morning gathering. As the summer months roll on, consider five prayers you can pray for our weekly worship time.

Edify Your People

Edification is a primary purpose of the meeting of God's people. The word rendered "edification" in the New Testament was used within the world of construction. It referred to the manufacturing process whereby a building or structure was built. Just as construction workers build buildings, churches are ordained by God to build up people. Paul encouraged Timothy to have leadership that led to "godly edifying" (1 Timothy 1:4). Consequently, we should pray that our weekly gatherings contribute to such edification. As you look forward to Sunday morning, pray, "Lord, build us up!"

Encourage Your People

Encouragement is another purpose of the church. The author of Hebrews encouraged believers to be committed to "...encouraging each other, and all the more as you see the day approaching" (Hebrews 10:25). Within these dark and distressing days, there are a lot of things that can discourage us. As a result, we should pray for our Sunday morning worship times to be encouraging.

Educate Your People

To grow into all that God wants us to be, it is necessary for us to acquire a certain degree of truth and knowledge. When the mind is filled with heavenly information, spiritual transformation will result. It is for this reason that preaching and teaching are such a common part of the assembling of the body. God's people are called to "... grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). Every time you think about Sunday's gathering, pray, "Lord, educate your people!"

Enlighten Your People

Living in a fallen world can cloud our vision. The stuff we encounter Monday through Saturday has a way of making us lose sight of what's most important, but Sunday mornings have a way of refreshing our perspective. Through worship and the Word, preaching and praise, singing and Scripture, our countenances can be refreshed and our heads can be lifted. John talked about how divine enlightenment can take place in the lives of God's people. He said, "...the anointing you received from him remains in you, and you don't need anyone to teach you. Instead, his anointing teaches you about all things and is true and is not a lie; just as it has taught you" (1 John 2:27). When you pray for your church, pray, "Lord, enlighten your people!"

Evangelize Your People

Jesus once told His disciples, "But I have other sheep that are not from this sheep pen; I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. Then there will be one flock, one shepherd"

(John 10:16). Our Lord referenced the inclusion of Gentiles in God's plan of salvation. However, there is a principle for believers of all generations in Jesus' words. At this very moment, there are people who are not yet a part of the church who will one day be a part of the church. When we think about Sunday mornings, we should desire for souls to be saved. We should regularly pray for our gathering times by saying, "Lord, save someone this Sunday!"

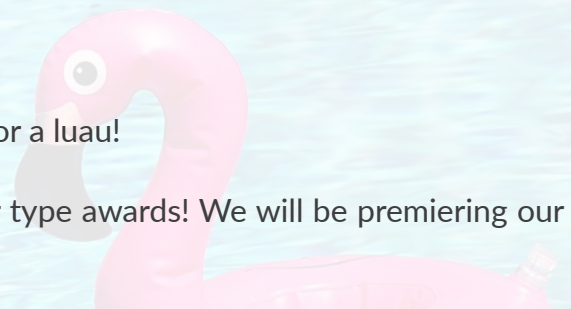

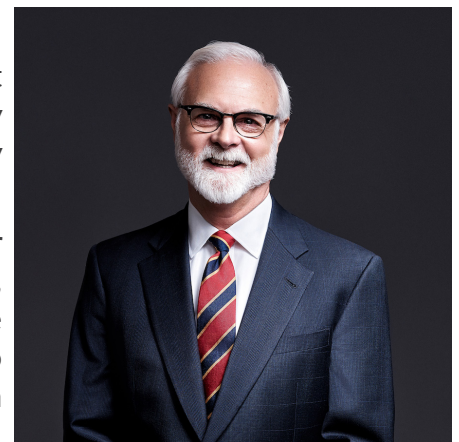
