### From our Pastor

# **Staying Sensitive to the Spirit**

Acts 5 contains a rather startling story. It details how a husband and wife lied to, and essentially stole from, the early church. Having been made alive by an outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:2-4), the earliest believers exhibited a deep commitment to generosity. Scripture says (Acts 4:34-35) seeing some make large contributions, a husband and wife named Ananias and Sapphira pretended to give a generous gift. They sold a piece of personal property, kept a portion of the proceeds for themselves, and then made a donation to the church, acting as if they gave all of the earnings they had received from the sale of the property (Acts 5:1-2). Knowing what had



happened, Peter confronted the husband, saying, "...why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and keep back part of the proceeds of the land?" (Acts 5:3).

Peter's rebuke provides a beneath-the-surface look at what transpires when we sin in a grievous way. Flagrant violations of God's Law actually require us to "lie to the Holy Spirit." From reading the account of Acts 5, it is interesting to note that neither Ananias nor his wife had yet to lie to the congregation verbally (Acts 5:8). However, they had already lied to the Holy Spirit. Their greedy act involved deceit toward God Himself.

How did Ananias and Sapphira's sin constitute lying against God? The reason is rather simple. When a believer is born again (John 3:3), he or she receives a portion of God's Spirit to live within his or her soul (Galatians 3:2). The Holy Spirit then works to convict believers of sin. Jesus said, "When he comes, he will convict the world about sin, righteousness, and judgment" (John 16:8). Even after salvation, the Holy Spirit continues such work in the lives of believers. James said, "The spirit he made to dwell in us envies intensely..." (James 4:5).

The Holy Spirit functions like an inner-governor or radar in our lives. When we are tempted to think, speak, or act in a way that dishonors God's character, He emits warning notifications in our souls. If you are a believer, surely you have experienced this aspect of His work? Do you know what it is like to experience the Spirit's promptings and nudges?

According to Peter's rebuke of Ananias, believers can be guilty of lying against the Spirit. Such takes place when we resist His work of conviction and instruction in our lives. The fate and consequences of such lying is disastrous. For Ananias and Sapphira, the result was immediate death. The Lord used their folly as an occasion for teaching a grave lesson to the church concerning the sin of resisting the Spirit (Acts 5:10-11). To our knowledge, the Lord doesn't strike believers dead nowadays for sins against the Spirit (Hebrews 2:3-4). He could (1 John 5:16), but we don't have the ability to decipher exactly when He works in such ways. However, we can be assured that all lying against the Spirit does result in a certain degree of spiritual death. The Bible warns believers about quenching and stifling the work of the Spirit (Ephesians 4:30; 1 Thessalonians 5:19).

As we turn our eyes to a new school year and a fall season full of ministry in our church, let's aim to be sensitive to the Spirit's work in our lives. May God give us grace to not shut down the Spirit's prompts. We should examine ourselves regularly to see if there is any habit or attitude that suppresses the Spirit's truth. Extra spiritual care should be given to root out any sin that has become a stronghold. We should erect boundaries and enlist accountability partners to insulate ourselves from temptations to sin against the Spirit.

Let's remember that God's work is accomplished by God's Spirit alone (Zechariah 4:6; Acts 1:8). If we are guilty of grieving Him through speech patterns, secret sin, and inter-relational strife, we will quench His moving in our midst. However, if we stay sensitive to His leadership, we can expect God to bless and build our church! The Bible says, "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. We all, with unveiled faces, are looking as in a mirror at, the glory of the Lord and are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory; this is from the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:17-18).

The word "ordination" may not appear in Scripture, but the concept does. Words like "missions" and "Trinity" aren't explicitly referenced in the Bible either, but we use them to refer to important Christian realities. The same is true with ordination. We use it as a label for the Biblical practice of selecting, appointing, and publicly commissioning men to one of the two offices of the church.

In ordination, men will be placed "before" the church (Acts 6:6). Such a visible presentation is important, as it makes the church body aware of who is being commissioned to serve. Next, ordination involves a time of prayer (Acts 6:6). The activity is important as it involves a recognition of a need for God's help, along with a request for such help as well. Finally, ordination involves the laying on of hands. The gesture is a symbolic one that depicts a transfer of authority to those being ordained.

On August 28 at 5:00 pm in the Worship Center, we will ordain a group of men to our deacon ministry. I hope our church family sees the Biblical importance of this special time of worship. If you are available, please make plans to attend. It has often been said, "As goes the leadership, so goes the church." The future of Tabernacle's health and vibrancy is dependent on our commitment to raise up the next generation of leaders and servants. Let's be present on August 28 to celebrate and support the God-given office of the deacon ministry!

# **Deacon Ordination - August 28**

Baptists are known for a handful of distinct Scriptural convictions. Years ago, I heard someone use the word "B.A.P.T.I.S.T." as an acronym to depict such realities. The "B" stood for Biblical authority. One of the two uses of "T" stood for "two offices." When I first heard reference to that idea, I didn't know what it meant. In time, I learned it referred to the two offices for the local church — pastor and deacon. We see an explicit mention to these two groups of people in Philippians 1:1. In that verse, Paul said, "Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus: To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, including the overseers and deacons."

The word "overseers" is used interchangeably with other terms in the New Testament to speak of what we often call "pastors" (Titus 1:5-9; 1 Peter 5:1-5). The word "deacon" is one that sometimes appears alongside that of "pastor" or "overseer." It speaks of a secondary office within the church. Paul's words in 1 Timothy 3:1-13 seem to make it clear that the early church regarded pastors and deacons as forming the two ordained offices of leadership for the local church.

Why do I share all of this? Well, on August 28, we will have a special worship service in which we will ordain new deacons. The Scriptural precedent for this practice is found in Acts 6. That passage describes the appointment of the first deacons by saying, "So they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a convert from Antioch. They had them stand before the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them" (Acts 6:5-6).


